History

The University of Nebraska-Lincoln Emeriti Association was formed on January 12, 1961, under the direction of Dean Emeritus Nels Bengtson, a former professor of geography. Dr. Bengtson served as the Association's first president. After Dr. Bengtson's term in office, Dr. Harald Holck became president, serving from 1963 until 1973, at which time he assumed the position of full-time unpaid executive secretary for the Association. Dr. Holck receives credit for the growth and development of the Association, including gaining benefits to members such as a campus parking pass.

When the Association formed there were fewer than 200 living Emeriti. Today that number exceeds 600. The Association's website and listserv provide opportunities for members residing around the world to maintain contact with their former colleagues and UNL regardless of their current address.
