

# Emeriti Association University of Nebraska-Lincoln

## Purposes

The University of Nebraska-Lincoln Emeriti Association is organized to:

- promote socialization among emeriti;
- foster discussions about issues of mutual concern at monthly meetings; and
- provide opportunities for sharing expertise with members of the university community.

## Activities

The activities of the association are intended to promote socializing, discussing and sharing. Most presentations at the meetings are available as podcasts and as video web files on the Association's website.

## Communicating

Communication among members is facilitated by the Association's listserv. Members may join the listserv by clicking on the listserv tab on the website ([emeriti.unl.edu](http://emeriti.unl.edu)) and following the directions therein. The website also is the repository for the Association's history, organization, minutes, membership, schedule of activities and provides the opportunity for members to vote on Association matters and officers, even though they can not be present for the meetings.

## Socializing

An important part of every meeting is the informal bring-your-own lunch visiting time with former colleagues and other university members. The meeting room is open and refreshments are available prior to the start of the monthly membership meetings to facilitate visiting and interaction among members and their guests.

## Discussing

Association programs offer diverse subjects for discussion at meetings, such as cultural themes related to the arts; scientific phenomena; media issues; travelogues; and, community and university interactions. Members help decide the programs. Presenters have included university scholars, business, political, professional and community organizational representatives.

## Meeting

Association meetings are held in the East Campus Union on the third Tuesday of each month, October to April. In addition, members are invited to two complimentary luncheons, one in May hosted by the UN president and the other in September as guests of the UN Foundation.

## Sharing

The Association provides numerous opportunities for its members to share their interests and expertise with one another and with other members of the university community. Members are encouraged to participate in ongoing educational experiences with UNL faculty and students.

## Membership

Association membership is open to those retired UNL faculty (and those UNL administrators) that have been granted emeriti status by the UN Board of Regents. The annual dues are \$5. Many emeriti choose to become life-time members by paying a one-time fee of \$100 of which a portion is deposited in the UN Foundation to build the Association's endowment fund.
